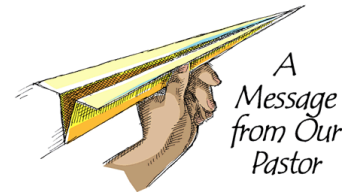

From Dawn's Desk

In the past two weeks I have read in the newspaper about children being abused by members of their Concord churches, and the church leadership covering it up when they learned about it. Because these cases and others have made the news over recent years, I thought it might be a good time to highlight Brookside's Child Protection Policy established to protect our young people (ages 17 and under) from undue risk of verbal, physical, or sexual abuse.



The Policy authorizes the Board of Christian Education to evaluate all volunteers who work with minors; and the Board of Trustees to evaluate all paid employees. This may include a criminal background check. Before clergy in the United Church of Christ can circulate their profiles to churches, we must have a criminal background check which becomes part of our profile.

Volunteers who work with youth must be members or regular attendees of Brookside for a minimum of six months before being eligible to work as a teacher or group leader. Those working with minors must observe the "two-person rule" and/or "open view rule" at all times. The "two person rule" requires that employees, volunteers, and supervisors should avoid situations where one worker is alone with children without a partner. If the "two person rule" is not practical, then the "open view rule" is observed where an open door or split door with an observation window allows the interior of the room to be visible. When a child in fifth grade or under needs to use the restroom, one adult will check out the restroom before the child enters and wait outside to escort the child back to the room.

Staff and volunteers should never remove a young person from church property, or take a child home, without the verbal or written approval of the ministry's supervisor and the parent/guardian. Brookside does not sanction or permit corporal punishment of any kind by its staff and volunteers; nor are workers with children allowed to yell, scream in anger, or threaten a child through bodily motions that may scare the child.

Staff and volunteers are primarily responsible for children and youth from a designated drop-off point within the church to dismissal. Children through fourth grade will be released from activities only into the hands of a parent/guardian or designated adult. All nursery through kindergarten children should wear a name tag and be signed in by a parent or designated adult. Children under 5 will be released only to a parent or designated adult with appropriate identification.

Brookside staff and volunteers follow the NH mandatory reporting Law to the Police of suspected harm or abuse to a minor. Even pastors are mandated to report suspected cases of child abuse; there is no clergy confidentiality in cases of child abuse.

All these requirements are meant to insure the safety of Brookside's children. Children are God's precious gifts, and all adults, by virtue of the promises the congregation makes at baptism, have the responsibility to insure the child's well-being and growth in Christian discipleship. When abuse occurs and is covered up by a church, the child suffers a profound betrayal of trust that has ramifications into adulthood for one's mental and spiritual health. Such a betrayal can adversely affect one's faith which may explain why Jesus is so severe in his admonition not to put a stumbling block before a child who believes in him: *If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were fastened around your neck and you were drowned in the depth of the sea! Mt. 18:6*

I am glad for the foresight Brookside had to put into place a Child Protection Policy, and I thought you should know about it.

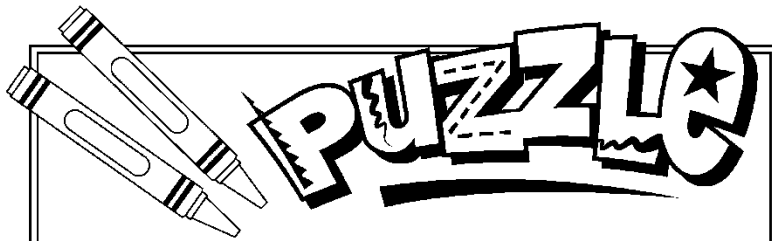

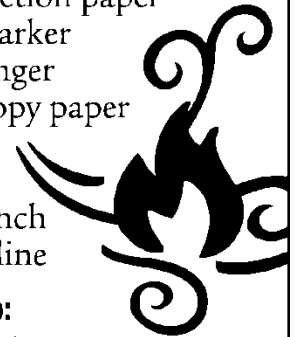


PENTECOST MOBILE

Make this craft as a reminder that God's Holy Spirit is all around you.

What you need:

- Tissue paper (red, yellow, orange), torn into squares
- Plastic transparency
- Craft glue
- Paintbrush
- Construction paper
- Black marker
- Wire hanger
- White copy paper
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Hole punch
- Fishing line



What you do:

1. Overlap tissue squares as "flames" on the transparency.
2. "Paint" glue (thinned with water) over the squares.
3. Fold construction paper in half. Write out Acts 2:4 at the top, by the fold.
4. Poke the hanger through the middle of the fold.
5. On the white paper, write "Holy Spirit" in English, Spanish (*Espiritu Santo*), French (*L'esprit Saint*), etc.
6. Cut out a flame pattern and trace it on the back of the transparency.
7. Cut out flames and glue the "Holy Spirit" names on them.
8. Thread fishing line through a hole atop each flame and tie flames onto the hanger.

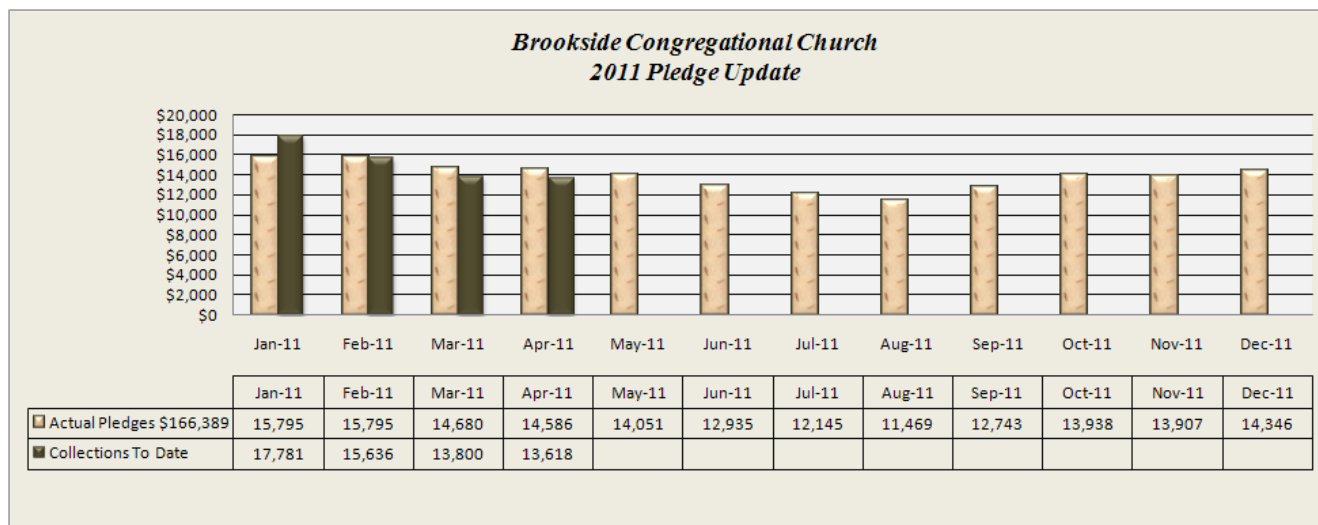
