## ***From Dawn's Desk***

At the special meeting of the congregation on December 11, 2011, those gathered unanimously passed a restructuring of Brookside's boards and committees and revision of the bylaws to accommodate the new structure. What does this new model of Governance mean?



- Respect and recognition of your time. There are many demands on your time, and cumbersome church meetings shouldn't be another. We have tried to streamline and provide a variety of ways to serve. Time on a ministry is reduced from 3 to 2 years, but with the option of recommitting for up to 3 terms. The number of ministries is reduced, and the use of short-term, focused task forces is encouraged. Accountability and reporting are streamlined for more efficient decision making.
- Moving from a business model to a church model of ministry where Christians are formed through worship and education, mission engages us to serve, and stewardship of our financial, physical, and human resources is attended. A Council of Ministries coordinates, makes policy, and prepares the budget.
- Living into a new paradigm takes patience and a willingness to try something together. Change is always a challenge, but it is less anxiety-producing when we are committed to be in this together, provide open and honest feedback, and keep a sense of humor. Remember, what doesn't work can be changed!

I am looking forward to this year ahead and its possibilities. My thanks to all who have served and to all who are beginning their ministries in February. God bless you all.

## ***Rotational Workshops Help Our Children to Grow in Faith***

In January we studied the book of Jonah in the workshops that focused on making choices. We had four workshops: Art led by Donna Molony, Cooking led by Joe Lachance, Music led by Kelly Van Nort, and Video led by Amy Woloski. One Video workshop was led by Sarah Duffley because Amy was sick the first Sunday of the Unit. On January 15<sup>th</sup> the children enjoyed a multi-age cooking workshop where we talked about the food that Jonah might have taken with him on his journeys. We then put together 36 bags of trail mix with nuts and 13 bags of trail mix without nuts that were taken to the soup kitchen to be handed out.

On **February 5** we start a new unit, "Man Beside Pool." In this unit the children will explore the story of Jesus healing the man who was lame at the pool. They will study what sabbath-keeping meant in Jesus' day. They will also consider where healing comes from today and how we can be sources of God's healing for others, as well as discover ways to be sensitive to and inclusive of all people. With a holiday weekend and vacation in February, there will be only two weeks of regular workshops, and these will be a little different. Watch the bulletin for information about the workshops.

Second is a free DVD called "Kingsley's Meadow," a four-DVD set of Bible stories. Each story has a theme which is central to the story. The story is acted out by children in costume as it is told. There are songs for each story and the presentation has humor as well as important values that are stressed.

Third is the quarterly *Spark Family* magazine, with a new issue having arrived recently. It is stocked in the Narthex and the back hallway by the church office.

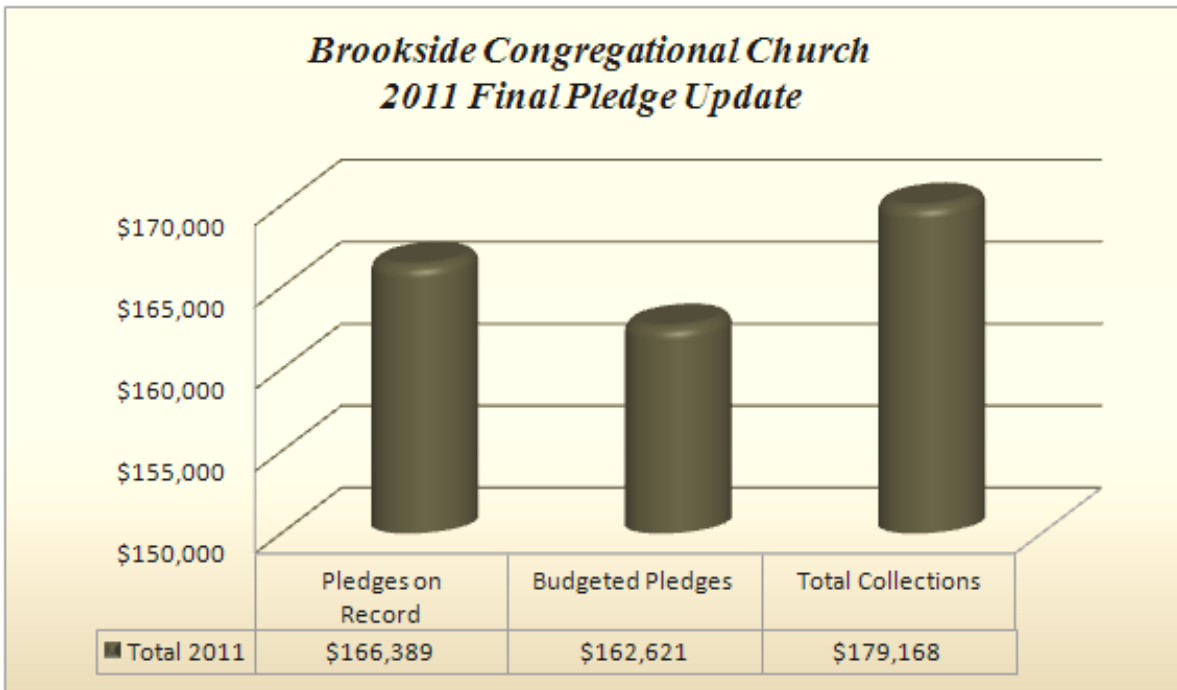
